The Oklahoma Junior Academy of Science held its annual meeting March 25-27 on the campus of East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma. This meeting is held in conjunction with the Oklahoma State Science & Engineering Fair, so it is often a challenge to avoid scheduling conflicts. Dr. Rahmona Thompson, OJAS Director, did an excellent job organizing the oral presentations and research papers submitted by the students.

The number of students participating in the 2010 OJAS event rebounded from a reduced participation in 2009. The judges did an excellent job evaluating the papers and the student presentations. The quality of research remains high and the judges were sometimes challenged to determine award recipients. However, when the dust settled, everyone agreed the most deserving students were receiving the top awards. Four students were invited to represent Oklahoma as delegates to the 2011 AAAS / AJAS Meeting in Washington, DC and all are excited to have been selected.

OAS is a Publisher

After many years as a serial publisher of *Proceedings of the Oklahoma Academy of Science*, the Academy has added book publisher to its portfolio. Past OAS President Ulrich Melcher has spearheaded this new venture.

After many years as a serial publisher of Proceedings of the Oklahoma Academy of Science, the Academy has added book publisher to its portfolio. In 2009, thanks to financing obtained by LIBRA (Laboratory for Innovative Biodiversity Research and Analysis) at Oklahoma State University (OSU), the Academy acquired a block of ISBN numbers to use on publications. The first (ISBN 0-9843264-0-5) was issued in 2009 for Lessons from the Prairie. Research at the Nature Conservancy's Tallgrass Prairie Preserve. It was written by then OSU graduate student Matthew S. Allen with assistance from Robert G. Hamilton of the Nature Conservancy, and Allen's advisor, Michael W. Palmer. I contributed a small part about virus research in the preserve.

The second publication, due out shortly (ISBN 0-9843264-1-3), is Design Guidelines for Sustainable Biological Field Stations by Khaled Mansy and Gregory Gundersen of OSU's

School of Architecture with Palmer acting as Project Coordinator. A National Science Foundation grant (DBI-0533896) supported the work on which the design manual was based. The goal and hope of the manual is expressed in the following quotation from the book's preface. "Buildings alter their surroundings and sometimes they interfere with or disrupt the native ecosystems. However, with sensitive design and careful operation and management, buildings can perform in harmony with the environment or at least minimize their invasive impact to an absolute minimum."

The request for ISBN numbers for each of these two publications was presented to the Executive Council of the Academy with my recommendation for approval. A similar procedure will be used for other requests to have the OAS imprimatur on publications produced by Academy members. I am the person to contact with such requests since I was Academy President at the time of the first request and am in charge of the remaining eight numbers.
